ENVIRONMENTAL NOTES FROM DAN WILEY

Report on Milfoil Eradication: It appears that the 2009 limited SONAR treatment has completed the kill of milfoil in the lake. At present, no milfoil has been found remaining anywhere in the lake.

The exact reasons why we needed the "bump" treatment following our 2008 full lake SONAR treatment are not definitive but include surplus energy storage in the milfoil roots, late application of product and volume/mass of milfoil plants to be killed. Excessive rainfall may have diluted the product. We never received the sampling bottles requested for an analysis of the 2009 project but Sepro did provide the product at no charge. Our licensed applicator, Keith McCarty did not bill us for his services. NYS grant money paid for half the costs.

We will monitor the lake for re-appearance of milfoil in 2010 and schedule spot Hydorraking to remove any hot spots and determine the timing of our next sonar treatment
